
Using Penultimate

1. Open Penultimate

2. To take a very detailed tour of Penultimate view the book that is titled "**Welcome to Penultimate**"

3. This will guide you through all buttons and choices. Take notes of ways to ensure wrist protection and how to insert your graphics.

4. To create your own book, select the icon in the upper right corner that says "**New Notebook**"

5. To connect with your Dropbox account click the settings "gear" in the upper right corner and select the Dropbox icon. *Note: Can also be connected with an Evernote account.

6. The "Settings" menu will give you many choices to change paper design, adjust wrist position for right and left handed and toggle Wrist Protection on and off.



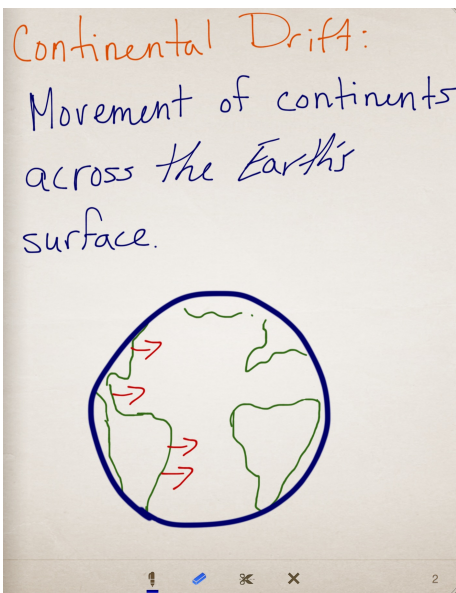

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Procedure

1. Open Penultimate
2. Create a new notebook for your selected subject.



3. Choose the paper type that best supports your notes. (Ex. Graph paper for math, plain white paper for drawing, etc.) *Note: you can change paper type per page of your notebook.*
4. For page one write down 3 important facts from the book you just read.
5. On page two change it to a blank background and illustrate one of the facts you found in your book.
